

Eydie Nash Gaiser Confirmed to Office of Vice President

Eydie Nash Gaiser, Clerk of Court for the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia, was confirmed by the Executive Committee to the office of Vice President of the National Conference of Appellate Court Clerks.

Eydie was appointed the Clerk of the Supreme Court of Appeals on November 1, 2017. Previously, she served as the Deputy Clerk of the Supreme Court of Appeals of West Virginia from August 2003 until her appointment as Clerk. Prior to her employment with the Supreme Court of Appeals, Eydie was engaged in private practice, followed by employment with the Office of the State Courts Administrator for the Florida Supreme Court. Eydie completed her undergraduate studies at Wheeling Jesuit University and earned her law degree from Duquesne University School of Law.
